**4TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME****JANUARY 31, 2010****REFLECTIONS****Good News!**

January 31

Nazareth feels familiar to us because we know from the Gospels that Jesus grew up there. How big a deal was it in the first century? Not very big. Jesus' hometown was small and ordinary. The synagogue in Jesus' town was small and ordinary too.

There is comfort in a place where we go often, a dependability. Comfort and dependability are good. Of course, an ordinary place might be a place for boredom too. An ordinary place might have a welcome routine, a familiarity that helps deeper insights grow. But routine can mean monotony—just going through the motions.

What might liven it up?

Jesus threw his ordinary Nazareth congregation into a spirited discussion by claiming that on that day something extraordinary was happening. The Scriptures, the ones he just read, were fulfilled—right there. Could they see it?

The reaction of Jesus' audience seems odd to us because we know the next chapters of the story. We know who Jesus is. The people in Nazareth couldn't see it. We know this man. Isn't that Joseph's son up there? Isn't he just an ordinary guy from Nazareth?

The same sorts of challenges and discussions continue to ripple through other congregations after Jesus' sermon. Saint Paul claimed there were no more divisions of Jews and Gentiles.

Others have preached no more divisions between black and white. How close to home do these sermons come? English speakers and those talking in another language? No longer divided. Those in the suburbs and those in the city? Working together now. Rich and poor at one table?

Which response would we ordinarily expect to this type of preaching: "How can we make this happen?" or "Who does this guy think he is?"

From the Pastors Desk

Christmas at St. Francis.

Almost 5000 people attended Christmas Services at St. Francis of Assisi. This number is almost twice the number of people who come here on a given weekend. To attend to such a large number of people, who identify with St. Francis of Assisi, and see this as their parish we had to provide six services on Christmas Eve and three services on Christmas Day.

We added two services at 4pm, one in the Chapel and one in the Gathering Space. We also had two services at 6pm, one at 9pm and one at midnight.

On Christmas day, we had three services, all in the Chapel. All of them well attended and the 12:30pm service was so large, that people filled the Narthex and overflowed onto the courtyard outside of the Chapel.

As well as dealing with the space challenges in the Chapel and Gathering Space, we also tried to deal with the large number of cars by providing a police presence at the Northern entrance to the campus and by having our own facility people monitor the parking lots. We thank all of you for your patience and forbearance.

The ministers in all of the services did a wonderful job of greeting, welcoming, and managing and ministering to this huge number of people. We thank our staff for the work that they did. Special mention goes to Ray Crisologo, our Music Director, who provided good Christmas music at all of the services.

We thank Willy and Rosie our office staff and the presiders in all of the services.

Our task at Christmas time is to put our best foot forward and give the many people who come on that day enticement to come back again and become involved in St. Francis.

The large number of people out there gives us a challenge to reach out to them through evangelization efforts. Our church is essentially missionary. What does that mean in our situation?

A more basic and urgent question is "What will we do for Easter?"

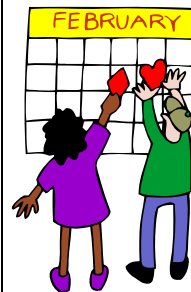
Quinceañera
